Father's Day, June 21 is more than a holiday – this year, it's a line in the sand.

Every man is leaving a legacy – whether he intends to or not. The only question is whether that legacy will be marked by strength, obedience, and courage, or by passivity and regret. On Father's Day, you are invited to take a public stand before God and your family by making ***the Courageous Commitment***.

What is the Courageous Commitment?

It is a decision to lead – first yourself, then your home – according to God's Word. It is not emotional or symbolic. It is a clear commitment to live as a disciplined, God-fearing man. If you choose to proceed, here is what is required.

The Courageous Commitment

_____ **1. Sign up at tagchurch.org** (Look for: Make *The Courageous Commitment*) By signing up, you are committing – before God – to the following disciplines: (on the honor system):

_____ **2. Watch the movie COURAGEOUS.** Before Father's Day, on your own or with other men. This is preparation, not entertainment.

_____ **3. Pray every day.** Confess sin as the Holy Spirit convicts you. Make things right where you have failed. Remove anything that weakens your walk with God or undermines your leadership at home.

_____ **4. Walk in accountability with another man making this commitment.** This is brotherhood, not isolation. Challenge one another weekly – face to face or by phone – to remain disciplined, obedient, and prayerful. *"As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another."* (See Proverbs 27:17).

_____ **5. Memorize Scripture.** Joshua 1:9 and Joshua 24:15 (We will recite these 2 verses together during the Commitment Ceremony)

Why This Matters

The Commitment Ceremony will mean very little if the days leading up to it are not marked by repentance, discipline, and obedience. Strong men prepare. Use these weeks to submit your heart and habits to the Lord.

Father's Day Commitment Ceremony

_____ **6. Attend the 10:30am service on Father's Day.**

Dress with intention – your best clothes (a suit & tie if you have one). If you are married or have children, invite them to stand with you. Single men will also be included. We will close the service with a moment few men ever experience: standing before God, with your family beside you, declaring your commitment out loud. Each man will receive a Resolution to sign and take home.

I am trusting God for marriages to be strengthened, homes to be healed, and men rise into the call God has placed on their lives. The path is clear. The responsibility is yours.

Strong men do not drift or delay. They decide.
